ARFF 100: Basic Aircraft Rescue Firefighting

2022 Class Dates: February 21-25, April 11-15, June 20-24, September 19-23, November 7-11

This 40-hour, weeklong course is structured to introduce and/or review the necessary skills, knowledge and techniques to perform aircraft rescue firefighting. This course follows the curriculum established in AC 150/5210-17C (Programs for Training of Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting Personnel) and consists of half-classroom and half-practical instruction. A class curriculum is available upon request.

Those wishing to obtain the International Fire Service Accreditation Congress (IFSAC) certification can also attend this class and take the written and skills tests at the end of the week, which will be administered by state IFSAC assessment personnel. The following IFSAC accreditations are required to attend if seeking IFSAC certification:

- Firefighting I & II
- Hazardous Material Awareness
- Hazardous Material Operations

Copies of certificates must be brought with attendee. Kentucky state firefighters should reference Kentucky State Fire School information for IFSAC testing options. In addition to the course fee, a \$25 check payable to the Kentucky State Fire Commission is required. **A 30-day notice of desiring an IFSAC Certification must be made prior to the start date of the class. Course Length: 40 hours**

Basic Course: \$1,000/student

Basic Course + IFSAC: \$1,100/student (An additional \$25 must be paid to the Kentucky State Fire Commission for assessor fees.)

ARFF 300: Basic Recertification Live Fire Drill

This course is designed to meet FAA requirements for a live fire drill under Part 139.319. The Fuel Spill Trainer will be used for truck or hand line evolutions as requested by attendees to meet department requirements. **Cost: \$325/student**

ARFF 301: Initial Certification Live Fire Drill

The Initial Certification Live Fire Drill consists of a live fire drill utilizing the fuel spill simulator and meets the FAA requirements for a live fire drill under Part 139.319. **Documentation must be provided indicating the attendee has received the required training in the 12 areas required by 14 CFR Part 139 prior to attending this course.** We recommend additional training simulations, such as wheel & brake fires, interior fires and search and rescue from a regional jet for an additional fee of \$100.

Base Cost: \$325/student

Cost with Additional Fire Simulations: \$425/student



ARFF 302: Advanced Recertification Live Fire Drill

This course is designed to meet FAA requirements for completing a live fire drill within 12 calendar months of the previous live fire drill. The live fire drill will consist of the fuel spill simulator using handlines or truck based on the department's needs. Additional options include the following training simulations: wheel & brake fires, interior live fire drills and search and rescue from our regional jet. **Cost: \$425/student**

ARFF 400: Basic Structural Approach to ARFF

Intended to prepare the structural firefighter/department to mitigate aircraft accidents and incidents, this course will discuss topics including aircraft familiarization, tactics and strategies, rescue techniques, and fire suppression as well as adapting structural equipment for aircraft rescue firefighting. Live fire drills included. This course is currently offered to groups only. **Course Length: 8 hours; Cost: \$200**

SPECIAL EMPHASIS INSTRUCTION (2022)

Special Emphasis Instruction classes are designed to impart specific knowledge for any number of ARFF issues including emerging trends, tactics, strategy and leadership. These class offerings change annually.

ARFF 502: Response to Rotorcraft Accidents

2022 Class Dates: May 26-27

To familiarize the attendee with the helicopter and responding to accidents involving a helicopter, topics such as the types of accidents, survival factors, occupant injury patterns and safety around helicopters will be discussed. Other topics will include LZ considerations. The second day will feature a close look at the specific features of helicopters, and students will complete firefighting evolutions on a helicopter simulator. **Course Length: 16 hours; Cost: \$250/student**
